Child Abuse Prevention Center Charity Golf Classic Breaks Records

(September 14, 2017)— The Orange County Child Abuse Prevention Center broke their fundraising record on August 31, 2017 with the 16th Annual Charity Golf Classic at Pelican Hill Golf Club in Newport Beach. The Center raised over \$110,000 at the event, surpassing their previous 15 years of the annual golf event.
